

Corrosion Control Services

Corrosion control services provide in-depth investigation of corrosion problems and the development of plans for remedial action. Corrosion control services available include: conducting surveys to identify corrosion problems; evaluating corrosion damage to facilities; testing and evaluating effectiveness of cathodic protection systems; evaluating protective coating failures; providing economic analysis and cost estimates for installation or repair of corrosion control systems; preparation of Special Projects or DD Form 1391 and design documentation needed for installation or repair of corrosion control systems.

Facilities inspected for corrosion control include: piers and waterfront structures, POL distribution and storage systems, natural gas distribution systems, steam and HTHW distribution systems, compressed air systems, water tanks and water treatment facilities, and other structures experiencing corrosion problems or protective coating failures.

Corrosion control services may be done by the Government Corrosion Specialist or by contract. For contract work, the Corrosion Specialist will prepare the scope of work and cost estimates. The Corrosion Specialist also reviews and provides comments on all field test data, corrosion survey reports, recommendations for corrosion control actions, and construction and maintenance project documentation.
